A- Research

As part of this review, I remodelled the QTAE and adjusted the content of ASE to fit the redesign. Overall, I am teaching 5 courses, at various programs, levels and topics: *Quantitative Techniques in applied Economics* for Bsc. (10 3-hour lectures), *Applied Statistics and Econometrics* for GDE (10 1.5-hour lectures), *Topics*

in Macroeconomics for PhD. (5 2-hour lectures), *Monetary Economics* for MSc. (5 2-hour lectures), *Economics: Theory, Policy and Institutions* for PPE MSc. (5 3-hour lectures).
