# **On-Going Projects**

Coaching Styles and Their Impacts on the Reintegration and Well-Being of the Unemployed As for many other commercial and non-commercial organisations, employment agencies are substituting face-to-face service provision for automated self-service applications. This project aims to help us understand how and for which groups this move towards E-coaching will affect the behaviour, the re-employment chances and well-being of the unemployed. Backed by the management of the Flemish employment agency and by the Flemish Ministry of Labour, we are preparing together with a local team manager the implementation of a randomized trial to evaluate the importance of the timing of a first face-to-face meeting with a job coach. The detailed administrative data as well as the possibility to send out surveys to customers will allow us to look beyond just the impact on unemployment spells.

#### Successful Labour Participation of Older Workers

Demographic ageing has been a trigger for policy makers to seek possibilities to extend the period during which individuals are actively on the labour market. It is not obvious, however, for older workers who become unemployed, to reintegrate into the labour market e.g. due to the relative high wage costs and the short time horizon in which training investments will need to pay off. This project aims to evaluate the effectiveness of a substantial employer's

subsidy in Flanders, introduced in April 2006, to hire individuals older than fifty years of age. The administrative data allow various identification strategies, and both the evaluation of short-term and long-term effects.
