Labour policy and unemployment issues are traditional macroeconomic topics if we take macroeconomics in broad sense not only as a very narrow neoclassical term.

### *Unemployment, productivity and general labour market flexibility*

I was one of the first researchers in Estonia who published an article about Estonian labour market changes in an international peer-reviewed journal in the early 90s (Eamets, 1994). I have been writing about general changes in Estonian labour market (Eamets, 1998), but also about youth unemployment (Eamets, 2000). Also I have been dealing with regional aspects of unemployment (Paas, Eamets, 1999, Eamets, 2003) and investigating the effects of macroeconomic shocks on Estonian labour market (Eamets, Varblane, Sõstra, 2003). The main conclusions from the earlier period studies are the following: Unemployment in the 90s was mostly structural; Traditional theory of optimal transition speed is not applicable in the case of Estonia, labour market flexibility in Estonia was very high; The most vulnerable group who suffered the most because of macro shocks was the low-skilled employees.

During the last 5 years I have observed how Estonian labour market has reacted to Great Depression (Eamets, 2013; Eamets, 2012; Eamets, 2011; Eamets, 2011). In the early 1990s Estonia introduced a rather unique economic policy. It was characterised by a limited monetary policy, low taxes, open foreign trade policy, annually balanced state budget, low public sector debts etc. We can conclude that the government did not have the efficient fiscal tools to smooth cyclical fluctuations. Additionally, the currency board system restricted the money supply as well as restraining inflation. In such a situation a flexible labour market appears to be an institution for macroeconomic adjustment.

I have been involved in some labour market prognoses as well. Mostly they were implemented as applied domestic research projects, although we managed to publish the results of one of those sectorial studies in a highly ranked journal *Energy Policy* (5-years IF 3.38) (Meriküll, Eamets, Humal, Espenberg, 2012). The main finding was that in the long-run the demand for highly-skilled labour will grow considerably in energy sector.

### *Labour market and education issues*

One of the major research interests during the last 5 years has been labour market and educational issues. From the earlier period we have made prognoses about future demand of PhD graduates in Estonia (Masso, Eamets, Meriküll, Kanep, 2009). We concluded that the potential annual number, that Estonia needs in the future, is 300 graduates from doctoral programmes. Today the Ministry of Education is using these results as target numbers in different strategic documents in Estonia. I was also involved in organising a conference of Education Economics, and later in editing the work of the conference publication (Backhaus, Eamets, Eerma, 2010). We got a lot of media attention after we published our first results of the University graduate studies (Espenberg et al, 2010; Meriküll et al, 2013; Espenberg, Eamets, Themas, 2011; Krillo, Themas, Eamets, 2011). I was a leader of the working group, and my main contribution was creating ideas, writing conclusions and editing those papers. I was also presenting the results in Estonian media.

The main findings indicated that there are several wrong assumptions and myths concerning young graduates from social sciences. When we look at the results then we can see that graduates from social sciences have very low unemployment rate, and their wages are one of the highest among fresh graduates. At the moment we are also preparing a paper about our most recent study - Study of effectiveness of Doctoral programmes in Estonia.

#### *Labour market mobility*

One of my main research areas has been labour market flexibility and labour mobility. Mobility here means change in position. It can be spatial (migration), occupational (occupational mobility), change in labour market state (labour market flows), sectoral etc.

We had a chance to use unique online CV data where people self-reported their previous job experience. Based on that, we analysed the effects of temporary migration on occupational mobility (Masso, Eamets, Mõtsmees, 2014). In addition, we observed the effects of mobility on innovation (Masso, Eamets, Mõtsmees, Philips, 2012). Our results show, contrary to our expectations, that previous experience of working abroad has no effect on later occupational mobility in Estonia. One potential explanation is the issue of over-education, as a large portion of Estonians who work abroad work in positions which do not correspond to their educational background. In short, educated people are hired in low-skilled jobs. In an innovation study we found that the effect of labour mobility appears mostly in product innovation.

One of the major achievements from the previous years was the editorial work for a special issue in International Journal of Manpower. The topic of the special issue was spatial mobility and labour market flexibility and the journal will be published in fall 2014. As invited guest editors (with K. Jaakson) we had to edit 8 articles and write an introductory article (Eamets, Jaakson, 2014). In addition to publications I together with T. Tammaru have initiated a series of seminars and conferences dedicated to migration issues. The main partner for University of Tartu in organising these events is Nordic Council of Ministers. We have organised two large conferences (250 participants) in spring 2013 and 2014, and one seminar about Smart migration policy in fall 2013. I have also been active in local media and conferences (Tiit, et al; 2013) presenting those migration issues.

With my colleagues A. Arrak, V. Trasberg, U. Soots and A. Viio, were the first ones in Estonia who started teaching modern economics (instead of soviet political economy) in 1989/1990 Spring Semester. As a result of these lecture series we produced several textbooks for undergraduates and secondary school level. In 1992-1996 we were also involved in training activities for school teachers' in cooperation with the American National Economics Education Association.

Today I am teaching mostly three-four types of topics like Basic Economics, Macroeconomics, Labour Economics and issues of general macroeconomic environment in Estonia (last for MBA and other open-university courses)

Recently I have been responsible for the methodology course for PhD students, the EU labour market course, the labour policy course etc.

Altogether I was involved in teaching 14 different subjects including 4 new courses during the period of 2009-2013.

In 2011 I started teaching in English - first, courses for Master's students (Economic environment) and then in 2012 courses for undergraduate students (Macroeconomics I).
